





### TANK – Terms of Reference

Greater Heretaunga and Ahuriri (TANK) Collaborative

as updated October 20 4, April 2016 and May 2018

#### 1. Purpose

This document updates the TAIN. Group's Terms of Reference which were adopted in 2012 to reflect the extension of the project timefram strough to 2017.

The purpose of this document is to describe and update the Context, Role and Operating Procedures for a Collaborative Stakeholder Group (the TANK Group).

The TANK Group has been convened to provide recommendations to the Regional Planning Committee for the management of land and water in the Greater Heretaunga and Aburin catchment area, comprising the Tutaekuri, Aburin, Ngaruroro and Karamu catchments and associated estuarine and coastal receiving environments.

The TANK Group will identify values, and recommend objectives, policies, rules and other methods to be included in the Regional Resource Management Plan (RRMP) to provide for those values. This area, including the coastal environments, will be colloquially referred to as the TANK catchments.

#### 2. Study Area - TANK catchments

The study area is shown in Appendix 1. The key reason for the extent of the study area is the interconnectedness of the Heretaunga Plains aguifer systems with the surface water catchments – Karamu, Ngaruroro, Tutakeuin and Tutakeuin-Valmante, Abururi and the Taipa and Nagier urban waterways. Some areas are more connected than others. The area will be broken down into manageable hydrological units which take into account the need to integrate the groundwater resource.

#### 3. Key Drivers

There are some 3600 current consents in the TANK catchment area representing approximately half of the region's consented activity. Of these, some 2500 (approx. 70%) relate to the taking and use of surface water and groundwater. The bulk of the Nagarurors and Marackalaho take segired in 2013, and the majority of the Tutaekuri consents expire in 2018. The majority of the groundwater takes some the Heretaurga Plains unconfined aquifer expire in 2019. The Karamu catchment consents up 2013.

The Nigaruraro catchment is at full allocation and the Karamu catchment is currently of scidered to be over allocated, largely by virtue of the Regional Resource Management Plan setting zero allocation limits.
